School Workshops at the Con

Conservatorium Open Academy can provide your school with a fun, engaging music workshop here at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. Our workshops are designed for High School students but some can be adapted for primary students. We're keen to be flexible so take a look at the standard options below then complete the form with a brief description of your dream workshop for your students and we'll see what we can do.

MUSIC FROM JAPAN – SHAKUHACHI BAMBOO FLUTE DEMONSTRATION/WORKSHOP

Shakuhachi Master Bronwyn Kirkpatrick will present this workshop and demonstration introducing the shakuhachi, the traditional Japanese bamboo flute. The demonstration will include the history of the shakuhachi and performances of different styles of music, from Zen Buddhist to contemporary. There will also be plenty of opportunity to try it out for yourselves! In the workshop we will work on making sound, and we will learn to read basic Japanese notation and to play some simple Japanese folk songs.

WORLD MUSIC WORKSHOPS

These workshops will investigate traditional music of the Balkans (eg. Bulgaria, Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia). We can offer either a vocal workshop or instrumental (students can bring their own guitars, brass, woodwind and we can supply percussion and keyboards). Students will learn to sing/play songs from this region.

LYRIC WRITING

Do your students make up their own songs? Would they like to? Writing song lyrics is a way for all students to be able to participate in making songs, whether they are skilled at playing a musical instrument or not, and this workshop will use different kinds of creative activities to engage them in the process of writing lyrics to their own songs, or to collaborate with others. Writing lyrics can also be a great way for students to listen deeply to the music they enjoy, and can also be a useful emotional outlet to articulate their experiences as young people. Combining their own vocabulary, voice and views of the world, and opening up their minds to the creative possibility of words in general, students can discover ways to access emotions and ideas they might not have otherwise found. At the end of this class, students will have learned about some really fun and simple aspects of music and will also have perhaps found a great new way to express themselves in lyrics and words.

Workshops are run on an "as requested" basis subject to tutor and room availabilities. The cost per student for a 90 min workshop is \$22 (this includes GST). There is a minimum number of 10 students

Simulated UCAT Day Workshop: 2-Day program

If you are in Yrs. 10, 11, 12, or perhaps you may be older and considering sitting the UCAT in the future, then this program is for you. The Simulated UCAT Workshop program is ideal and often a necessary step towards effective and efficient preparation for the UCAT.

This event will be conducted by the **National Institute of Education** in partnership in partnership with **UCAT Preparation Australia**, **MICAS** (Medical Interviews and Career Advice Services) and **PTTI** (Pro Training Tutorial Institute).

The workshop is primarily designed to cover fundamental techniques in navigating all five sections of the UCAT test and also for participants to gain a better understanding of their own level of preparedness for the test. Over the course of the years, the program has evolved into more comprehensive and holistic exercise, which not only achieves its primary goal, but it is also exposing students to a wealth of knowledge about all other aspects of the journey into a medical degree. The latest update has seen the program grow into a 2-Day event as the sheer amount of content covered was too great to fit into a 1-day program.

CSIRO Virtual work experience program

Are you the parent of a Year 10 or 11 high school student? Your child can gain first-hand experience of CSIRO's research in science or engineering by participating in our 2020 Virtual Work Experience Program.

The virtual work experience program supports students to undertake work experience despite COVID-19 interruptions and provides access to work experience opportunities for students who may face geographic or other barriers to participating in traditional work experience. It also allows students the opportunity to experience contemporary ways of working, from homes, and with people across geographic boundaries, just as CSIRO scientists do every day.

Virtual work experience allows students to undertake collaborative, group science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) projects, including projects linked to real-world CSIRO research and industry challenges. Instead of students attending a CSIRO site, experienced CSIRO staff or STEM industry professionals will supervise groups of students remotely using a secure online platform. The groups will comprise up to five students who may be remote from each other and who will work together to complete work and tasks that can be used as part of portfolios and help inform their study and/or career plans.
